A screening and discussion of the film "Poverty, Politics, and Religion" took place condensed and renamed (32-minutes, version of "Fishers of Men," produced by Ranjan Kamath and Padmavati Rao, 1997). ANNOUNCEMENT: HINDU-CHRISTIAN STUDIES BOOK AWARD

The Society for Hindu-Christian Studies invites nominations for the "Best Book in Hindu-Christian Studies, 2000-2002."

At its 2003 annual meeting, which will be held in conjunction with the annual meeting of American Academy of Religion, the Society for Hindu-Christian Studies will present an award to the best book in Hindu-Christian studies published between 2000-2002. To celebrate this work, the Society will also sponsor a panel discussion of the book to which the author will be invited to respond.

Until November 1, 2002 the Society invites nominations for this award. The book must be published in 2000, 2001, or 2002 and be a distinguished contribution to the field of Hindu-Christian studies. Such a

work may be (1) a comparative study of a theme(s) in Hindu and Christian traditions or of two (or more) thinkers from those traditions; (2) a work which traces some aspect of the cultural, historical, political, social, or theological interaction between Hindus and Christians (e.g., in early South Asian history, in the colonial period, in a contemporary setting, in a missionary context, in the diaspora, etc.); and/or (3) a study in which an author, belonging (religiously and/or culturally) to either the Hindu or the Christian tradition, reflexively undertakes a study of a concept, image, ritual, author, text, etc., from the other tradition, and thus bring it into dialogue with his or her own.
