According to the phonetics list in the Oxford English Dictionary, 2nd Ed., the phonetic symbols which represent the 5 major vowels as they are pronounced in the alphabet are:

A (e I) E (i:) I (a I) O ($\theta \sigma$) U (ju:)

I am searching for a word, hyphenated or otherwise, which contains just one each of the 5 phonetic symbols which represent the 5 major vowel sounds. On my journey, I found a number of words having just one each of 4 of the 5 major vocalic phonetic symbols:

Two hyphenated designations brought me very close to the Holy Grail of a phonetic AEIOU word. The first is CUTANEO-MENINGOSPINAL which contains all 5 phonetic symbols which represent the 5 major vowel sounds, plus an extraneous **au** (**0**):

U A E O O I u a e o o i <u>cutaneo-meningospinal</u> Cutaneo-meningospinal angiomatosis is known as Cobb's Syndrome.

The second is CUTANEO-MEDIASTINAL which has an extraneous i: (E):

U A E O E I u a e o e i c<u>utaneo</u>-m<u>e</u>diast<u>i</u>nal

Cutaneo-mediastinal sinus is a chest condition.
