
DOWN THE RABBIT HOLE



A puzzle. Place the 12 different letters of "DOWN THE RABBIT HOLE" on the nodes so that each line of three is an anagram of the following words. HAW, END, HID, HOB, LAR (household god), NIL, OWL, HER, ROD, TAN, THE, WIT.



A game. Two players alternately play their distinctive tokens on a node and the first to get a line of three wins.

Another puzzle. Place the same 12 letters on the nodes of this diagram so that each row of four anagrams into a common word.



Solutions. First puzzle. Place these letters in order from 1 to 12. W, L, O, T, N, A, E, R, H, I, D, B. The first player can always win by forcing second to waste a move (i.e., non-threatening) on his second player.

A possible answer to the second puzzle forms the words DOWN, HERB, BOAT, LINE, WITH, and LARD.
