Some animal and/or plant pairs are pals in the logological sense of forming **palindromes**. Whether or not they actually like each other is beyond our ken, but some are so remote that they probably never meet. All the below are Scrabble words unless marked W (Webster's 3rd), O (Oxford Eng.), or other sources as cited. The study excludes human pals (except our readers!).

moth tom — common insect, male cat

Suta catus — snake genus, cat (L.) (both Wikipedia)

titi tit — S.Am. monkey, small songbird

wasp saw — bee relative, sawfly

maypop yam — wildflower, sweet potato mint nim — aromatic herb, Indian tree oca maco — sorrel, Egyptian cotton (W)

mare ram — farmyard pals

tung nut — oilseed tree, plant embryo wahoo haw — elm (two types), hawthorn

ai pia — three-toed sloth, arrowroot plant

Aix ixia — dabbling duck genus (W), iris

ani pina — black cuckoo, pineapple

corn roc — food grain, roc (see cory above)

deer reed — cervid, marsh plant

dika kid — mango, young goat

drum urd — croaker fish, bean

euro rue — kangaroo, herbal shrub

eyra rye — jaguarundi, food/whisky grass

gnu tung — wildebeest, oilseed tree

ita zati — miriti palm, bonnet macaque

kae teak — jackdaw, hardwood tree

leek eel — onion relative, long fish

mink/mina nim — animal/bird, Indian tree

oka mako — sorrel (= oca; W), bonito shark

onager oregano — wild ass, cooking herb

pen nep — female swan, catmintragi gar — cereal grass, garpike

rape par — oil plant, young salmon

rasp sar — raspberry, sea bream

sipo topis — mahogany (W), antelopes (C)

smee neems — various ducks, nim trees

spore, *Merops* — fungus (etc), bee-eater genus (W)

Sula alus — booby genus (W), potatoes

taki kat — Mongolian horse, khat (stimulant shrub)

taro rat — food plant, unloved rodent

ti kit/nit/tit — tree, kitten/louse larva/songbird

ti pipit — small Pacific tree, wagtail bird

topi pot — antelope, cannabis

tuna nut — large ocean fish, embryonic plant

<u>Pal Gangs</u> (plus all the above involving plurals; eg, sakis sikas = at least four animals) kid kid dikdik — two goats, small antelope motmot tom tom — colourful tropical bird, two cats marmot tom ram — rodent, cat, sheep oka miro korimako – oca (W), NZ tree, NZ bellbird martin nit ram — \approx swallow, louse, sheep tangelo mole gnat — hybrid citrus, talpid, a fly marten egret toad napu panda otter genet ram — napu = chevrotain (W) + 7 common animals Self-pals 1. Indian shrub (O) mum — chrysanthemum yaray — fan palm (W) Jeff's and Dan Tilque's *Palindromicron II* (Word Ways monograph #6, 2002) lists another ~150 palindromic animals and plants, archaic or of non-English languages. <u>Fake Pals</u> (added **a** or **o** required) a croc, orca — crocodile, killer whale o, bonobo! — great ape, "pygmy chimp" a kaka — NZ parrot o, **Bubo!** — horned owl genus (W) a *Pipa* — Surinam toad genus (W) o, dodo! — famously extinct flightless bird a pup, *Upupa* — dog, bird genus (hoopoe, W) o, galago! — bushbaby (primate, loris relative) a tur, bruta — goat or pea, edentate (all W) o, Tyto! — barn owl genus (W) baobab, a boab — two names for same tree sumac, a Mus — see next, mouse genus (W) coral, a roc — coelenterate colony, roc

Finally, a couple that are not true pals but are circular pals of each other, neatly both at 32154: *Musca*, sumac — housefly genus (W), tree/shrub (cashew relative, one species poisonous).
